We are pleased to celebrate a successful year for Teachers Warehouse, a 100% volunteer-run non-profit organization. Support from the community, through volunteer support, financial contributions, and inkind donations, continues to be strong and our list of shoppers grows annually.

This year, our data related to shoppers and items distributed was impacted by two interesting developments. The 2023 Monroe County Community School Corporation referendum began providing free school supplies to students so teachers did not require as many basics from Teachers Warehouse (TW) as they had in the past. However, they still came to TW to find items to promote creativity and critical thinking, items that are not on the back-to-school supply list.

Unrelated, the Richland Bean Blossom schools underwent a huge renovation project. Teachers temporarily vacated their classrooms while work was being done and taught in areas where they couldn't store things they would normally picked up at TW. Despite these two oddities, we saw no decrease in demand, with the number of shoppers and the value of items distributed holding steady.

Support from local businesses and organizations continues to help us meet that need by conducting supply drives among their employees. Supporters included Cook Medical (all area sites), Smithville, GM Bedford, Great Western Casualty Company, and Woodhaven Christian Church.

During our annual Supply Drive, customers at the Bloomington Kroger stores and Bedford's Walmart shopped for TW and made generous cash contributions, helping us restock for the busy fall season.

In Spencer, grill master Steve Withem and Babbs Supermarket collaborated to conduct our first annual Pork Burger Cookout fundraiser, with the support of TW volunteer. Proceeds helped to stock the TW shelves.

Volunteers continue to be the backbone of TW. They empty dehumidifiers, sort donations, bundle crayons,

and serve in leadership positions. Among our most valued volunteers was Barb Marks, the long-time volunteer and operations manager who we lost this year. Barb's commitment to TW, reflected in the sizable bequest she left to the organization, will be felt for years to come.
